

Rural Health VA Maine

VA Maine Healthcare System is comprised of Togus Medical Center in Augusta, 7 Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs) and 2 Access Point Clinics located throughout the state. The Bangor CBOC serves over 7,000 Veterans and offers a wide range of services including primary care, mental health, cardiology, dental, dermatology, optometry, audiology, lab, radiology, and physical therapy. Bangor clinical pharmacists are integrated members of the Patient Aligned Care Team (PACT) and provide comprehensive medication management services to the Veterans of central Maine.



The PGY2 resident will longitudinally manage complex patients within a rural ambulatory practice. The resident will be integrated members of the PACT team and provide clinical pharmacy services in-clinic and remotely utilizing telehealth. The primary clinical site is Bangor; however, the resident may complete elective rotations at the Togus Medical Center or other CBOC.



Where is Bangor, Maine?

Bangor is located in central Maine, about 1.5 hours from Augusta, 2 hours from Portland, and 3.5 hours from Boston. Downtown Bangor offers diverse restaurants, bars, and shopping. The waterfront features annual concerts in the summer. Only an hour drive from Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park, a 2-hour drive to the Rangeley Mountains and ski resorts, and 2-hour drive to Canada. There are plenty of hiking trails and lakes nearby. The scenery is gorgeous and there's something for everyone!

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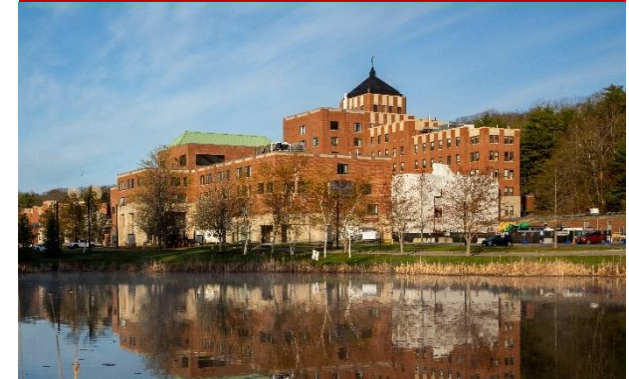
