Graduating residents will be well prepared to initiate psychiatric pharmacy specialty services within inpatient psychiatric facilities, patient centered ambulatory care teams, and residential rehab programs.

<u>Early Commit:</u> Available to current Cincinnati VA PGY1 residents. - 1st Friday in October

VA National Early Commit (VANEC): All current VA PGY1 residents. - 1st Friday in November

ASHP Match via PhORCAS

– January 5th – application deadline for remaining positions. Will be updated in PhORCAS in early December for the ASHP Match.

Application Eligibility:

- United States citizenship with proof of naturalization if naturalized.
- Completion of or in the process of completing an ASHP-Accredited PGY1 residency.
- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an accredited College of Pharmacy.
- Must be able to show documented proof for each requirement. Inability to provide proof of completion of an ASHP-Accredited PGY1 residency within 30 days of program start will result in immediate dismissal.
