Our residency provides a variety of learning opportunities to improve drug therapy outcomes and enhance pharmaceutical care, with mentoring and guidance from our clinical pharmacy team along the way. The residency is a 12 -month post-graduate program with specific goals and objectives designed to meet or exceed ASHP standards for each learning experience provided.
